2016-2017 HEATING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



HEATING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM HISTORY

For the past 11 years, the United Way has been able to help low income families in the Greater Carlisle area with emergency heating oil, propane or wood pellets. The primary goal of this program is to serve the “working poor” who may not qualify for other government assistance programs like LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program).

United Way offers assistance in the form of a cash grant, sent directly to the heating oil company, for households in immediate danger of being without heat.



United Way works in partnership with local heating oil dealers and local fuel assistance agencies to provide deliveries of 100 gallons of fuel to those in need only one time per heating season. The program begins on November 14, 2016 and continues until we have exhausted all of our funds.

We work collaboratively with Todd Baird Lindsey Foundation and Samaritan Fellowship to avoid duplication of services.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Must be a resident of Carlisle, Boiling Springs, Mount Holly Springs, New Kingstown, Plainfield or Newville.
- Applicants who qualify for LIHEAP (Low Income Heat Assistance Program) must utilize that resource (Initial & Crisis Grants) first before applying for this program.

INCOME: Gross household income cannot exceed the following levels (200% Federal poverty guidelines—see below).

1 Person	\$23,760
2 Persons	\$32,040
3 Persons	\$40,320
4 Persons	\$48,600
5 Persons	\$56,880
6 Persons	\$65,160
7 Persons	\$73,460
8 Persons	\$81,780

HOW DO YOU APPLY?

Applications will be accepted beginning **Monday, November 14, 2016.**

If 55 or over in age, refer to Todd Baird Lindsey Foundation (*Stacie Nickel, 717.486.4121*)

No application will be processed without the proper documentation as required (*proof of income, Identification and invoice/bill from heating vendor*).

Applications will be screened by staff and applicants will be asked to meet with the staff person for an intake interview.

Applications will be reviewed by the UWCCC Executive Director, who will make the final decision on whether or not an allocation is granted.
